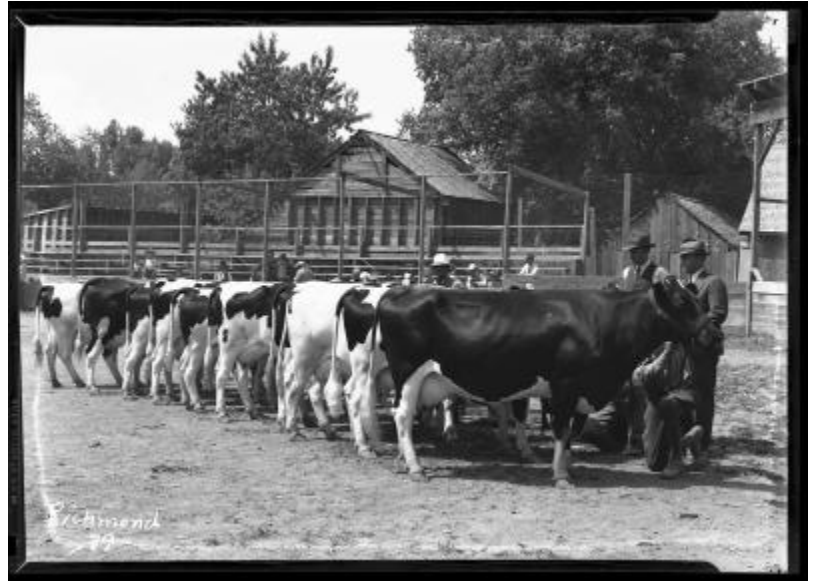


Black & White Days

The very first Holstein show in Richmond was held in 1912. Local dairymen drove their best Holsteins into the old LDS tithing yard (where Harris Dairyland is now located). Judges rode through the herds and picked out the best cattle.

A short break in 1913/14 was due to a national emergency caused by hoof-and-mouth disease when nearly ALL livestock shows and auctions were closed in the efforts to prevent the spread of the disease and to eradicate it from herds.



By 1915, though, the disease had been stopped (through vaccination and the destruction of infected animals and herds) and the show resumed. Since then, the show has continued uninterrupted.

As the cattle show and sale continued to grow, other events were added to the celebration. Carnival rides, food vendors, footraces, and a parade were incorporated. The Saturday evening horse pull now caps the week-long event.

PARADE

The Black & White Days parade is held on the Saturday of Black & White Days week and starts at 5:00 P.M.

It begins at 600 South State Street, heads north, turns west at Main Street, then turns south at 100 West, ending at the Park Community Center. The parade line up starts at 800 South State Street.

Dairy Show 2023



It's that time again to get **MOC**-ving on your dairy recipe ideas. We want as many (or more!) participants as we had last year! All ages welcome – kids especially love this contest! No entry fees required and you get a free T-shirt just for participation. There's always a gazillion prizes and gift cards to give away! It's a fun and friendly competition!

OBJECTIVE: Prepare a recipe using a dairy product(s) and showcase that prepared food with a *proper and creative* place setting to be judged.

Recipe: Prepare a recipe with at least one dairy product in it. Bring a copy of the recipe (ensure correct grammar) with you to display for the judges.

Food Display: Display your prepared food in the same pan or bowl that it was cooked or prepared in. This will be placed on a table that you bring with your creative place setting. Some setting ideas used in the past: beach theme, Harry Potter theme, princess theme, sports theme, picnic theme—anything! You'll need one proper place setting –a tablecloth, plate (or bowl), utensils, cup, and napkin all in their appropriate places. Creativity is the ticket!

Setup: Bring a table (big or small—even a mini picnic table works!) and set up your food display and place setting. Make sure to provide an extra utensil for the judges to taste-test your recipe. After setting up, leave everything there and plan on returning a little before 2pm to the Stake Center for prizes, give-aways, and clean-up.
